BYLAW NO. 232/98

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF MOSSBANK, I IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN, TO PI F THE CEMETERY OF THE TOWN OF MOSSBANK. TO PROVIDE

The Council of the Town of Mossbank in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts follows:

This Bylaw may be cited as the Cemetery Bylaw

2. INTERPRETATION: In this Bylaw

- 0 "Cemetery" shall mean all that portion known Lutheran Cemetery and the Mossbank Cemetery, on part of the SW 31-11-29 W2nd. situated
- 2) "Committee" means there shall be annually appointed by resolution of the Council from amongst their members, three (3) Councillors, and the Council may if deemed necessary appoint any other citizens to said committee which shall be called the "Cemetery Committee", who shall manage the affairs of the Cemetery.
- (3) "Council" means the Council of the Town of Mossbank.
- (4) "Caretaker" means an employee of the Town hired or appointed to take care of the Cemetery.
- 9 rol "Lot or Plot" shall mean the sub-division of land known by numbers on a plan of the cemetery, and includes an area of land eight (8) feet, by twelve (12) feet used two graves.

- 8) "Monument" means any structure in the Cemetery erected or constructed on any grave, lot or plot for memoriam purposes.

3. RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF LOT OWNERS:

- £ No grave coverings, cement bordering, fences, railings, curbs, coping and trellises, or any such ornament that interferes with the general maintenance of the Cemetery shall be allowed in the Cemetery.

4. MONUMENTS:

- (1) that such stones or monuments should be placed on foundations sufficient to carry same. The owner of any lot shall have the right to erect suitable stones or monuments thereon provided however to carry same.
- All monuments shall be made of cut stone, granite, marble or other material approved by the Cemetery Committee. No concrete monuments will be permitted. No board designating a grave shall be erected in the cemetery and no slab, that is: any stone other than a monument or flat head stone on a foundation, shall be allowed unless placed in a horizontal position.

- (6) Size of the concrete foundation shall be as follows:

Single Grave Plot - The foundation shall not exceed twenty-four (24) inches wide and thirty-six (36) inche long.

Two Grave Lot - The foundation shall not exceed twenty-four (24) inches wide and forty-two (42) inches long.

Three Grave Lot - The foundation shall not exceed twenty-four (24) inches wide and forty-eight (48) inches long.

Cremation Plot - The foundation shall not exceed eighteen (18) inches wide and thirty-two (32) inches long.

(8) Memorial or Monument Specifications:

Single Grave Plot - The die or top part shall not be larger than twelve (12) inches wide, twenty-four (24) inches long, and eight (8) inches high.

Two Grave Lot - The die or top part shall not be larger than twelve (12) inches wide, thirty (30) inches long, and eight (8) inches high.

Three Grave Lot - If there is to be more than one headstone used then each headstone shall be placed in accordance with the regulations set out for a single grave plot. If there is to be one headstone used it is to be placed in the centre of the plot in accordance with said regulations contained herein. When one headstone is to be used the die or top part shall not be larger than twelve (12) inches wide, thirty-six (36) inches long, and eight (8) inches high.

Cremation Plot - The die or top part shall not be larger than twelve (12) inches wide, twenty-four (24) inches long, and eight (8) inches high.

(9) The caretaker shall from time to time report to the owners or committee the condition of any monument of of repair, and it shall be the duty of any owner of such monument to repair same without delay to the satisfaction of the caretaker or committee.

5. VEHICLES IN THE CEMETERY:

- (1)Vehicles shall not travel at a greater rate of speed than 10 m.p.h. in the cemetery. Vehicles shall

Cremation Ashes shall be three (3) feet in depth from the surface of the ground.

- (13) Where more than one body is interred in the same grave the last interment shall be at a depth of at least four (4) feet from the surface of the ground to the top surface of the coffin enclosing the second body except in the case of two infants under two years of age, or an adult and an infant under two years of age.

Where cremation ashes are interred in the same grave as a body is interred, the urn shall be at a depth of three (3) feet from the surface of the ground.

- (14)The Administrator of the Town of Mossbank shall be the agent of the Town of Mossbank to sell and dispose of cemetery lots and payment thereof shall be made to said Administrator. said
- (15) The purchase price of any lot or plot shall be as recorded in Schedule "A" of this Bylaw. such Sun
- (16) No person or persons shall be allowed to light ignite a fire at any time within the enclosure cemetery unless authorized by the caretaker. o C

CONSECRATED GROUND:

7.

Certain sections of the cemetery have been consecrated

by certain religious denominations, and in the event of further portions being consecrated, such act of consecration shall not be held to invest the said religious body with any exclusive rights and powers of jurisdiction, either spiritual or temporal, within the cemetery limits and such religious body shall be subject to the rules and regulations governing the Town Cemetery.

8. BURIAL OF INDIGENT POOR:

- **(1)** The burial of indigent poor shall be in such portions of the cemetery as may from time to time be designated by the Town Council.
- 2 By order of the Mayor of the Town of Mossbank there shall be furnished single graves, without charge, for the dead of indigent poor of any denomination.

9. PENALTIES:

Anyone violating the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties under Section 92 (5) (b) of the Urban Municipality Act.

- ·oī This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the date of final passing thereof.
- 11. Bylaw No. 217/95 is hereby repealed.
