TOWN OF MOSSBANK

BYLAW NO. 218/95

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF MOSSBANK, IN THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN, CANADA, TO DESIGNATE A SITE AS MUNICIPAL HERITAGE PROPERTY.

WHEREAS Sections 11 and 12 [or 17 and 18] of The Heritage Property Act authorizes the Council of a Municipality to enact bylaws to designate real property, including all buildings, features and structures thereon, to be of heritage value; and,

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality has determined that the lands and premises known as:

Mossbank & District Museum Inc. the Schoolhouse, the Blacksmith Shop & Ambroz House

and located at:

115 Third Street West Mossbank, Saskatchewan

is a site of architectural, historical, cultural, environmental, archaeological, paleontological, aesthetic and/or scientific value; and,

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality has, not less than thirty (30) days prior to consideration of this bylaw, caused a Notice of Intention to Designate to be:

- served on the owners of said property;
- served on the Registrar of Heritage Property;
- c. registered on the Certificate of Title for said property in the appropriate Land Titles Office; and,
- d. published in one issue of a newspaper with general circulation in the municipality; and,

WHEREAS no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Council of the Municipality;

THEREFORE, the Council of the Municipality enacts as follows:

There is designated as Municipal Heritage Property the real property legally described as:

> All that portion of the North West Quarter of Section 30, Township 11, Range 29, West of the Second Meridian, Saskatchewan containing 0.75 of an acre as Parcel E on Plan BS 5065

Except: all that portion described as follows: commencing at the North West corner of Parcel E; thence Southerly along the Western limit 60 feet; thence Easterly and parallel with the Northern limit 120 feet; thence Northerly and parallel with the Western limit to the Northern limit; thence Westerly along the Northern limit to the point of commencement.

The significance of the site being:

- a. To preserve the property as it stands in its original state. A Pioneer room is located in the Schoolhouse with original artifacts of the pioneer days.
- b. The Blacksmith Shop is intact in its original location including all of the equipment.
- c. The Ambroz house, yard and pathways contain brickwork from the Claybank Brick Factory.

- 2. The Municipal Administrator/Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a Notice of Designation to be:
 - a. registered on the Certificate of Title for said property at the appropriate Land Titles Office; and,
 - b. served on the owners of said property.
- 3. The Municipal Administrator/Clerk is hereby authorized to cause a certified copy of this bylaw, with a copy of the Notice of Designation, to be served on the Registrar of Heritage Property.
